# Roger Sims

I did a Fanhistory panel with Roger and Pat. Where we told stories from our times in Fandom. This may have been the first time I heard about the car trip to Worldcon with Harlan Ellison and others. It was a challenging trip. At one point when flagged down by a police car, Harlan and Roger had to change seats in mid drive since Harlan did not have a drivers license. I envied Roger since he knew Harlan in New York when Harlan was trying to get published. I hope Roger to retell the story at the OASIS 30 Harlan Ellison remembrance panel.

At Anticipation, the 2009 Worldcon, I suggested to the convention that they should do a panel on Detention, the 1959 Worldcon in Detroit, since Roger, who co-chaired the con, was going to the con. They did it and Roger was joined by other attendees of Detention and told stories about the con. Detention was the first send out ballots for the Hugos (the Hugo Award procedures were not formalized at the time) and have an art show. Roger read a letter from the Detroit Police Department warning officer that science fiction fans were notorious hot rodders and money could be made of them by issuing speeding tickets. This may have been a hoax since there was a fan who later was a high ranking Detroit police officer. The Detroit Worldcon was a success and was able to pass along profits to the next Worldcon in Pittsburg.

Roger always should me kindness. He was always great to talk to. Good conversations were had.
