### FOURTH OF JULY PARTY DIRECTIONS

The address to Pat's place is the minutes and the Calendar. You can take I-4 and take the Conroy Road exit going west. You're on Conroy Road for about 3.5 miles. ### King Tut Exhibit

The Tutankhamun and the Golden Age of the Pharaohs exhibit is currently touring four cities in the United States. It will be stopping in Fort Lauderdale. The first is the overall exhibit website, the second is the Fort Lauderdale museum website. The social committee would like to find out if enough people would be interested for us to try to plan a group excursion to Fort Lauderdale.

Fort Lauderdale Dates: December 15th, 2005 through April 23rd 2006. The social committee is planning for sometime in January, or February.

Tickets for groups of 10 or more are now available \$30 or \$36 (w/audio tape) for weekend tours. They have a slightly cheaper rate for the weekday group tickets, but it was thought going on the weekend would not be feasible. At this time they believe that the single ticket rates will about the same as the weekend group rates. The individual tickets will not be on sale until October.

Groups tickets are sold with a prearranged museum entrance date/time. Drive time from Orlando to the Museum of Art in Fort Lauderdale in approximately 3.5 hours. The tour takes between 1 and 1.5 hours. They have a cafe located at the museum, for a quick bite before the tour: <http://www.storkscafe.com/> or there can pre-plan a stop for lunch along the way.

Because of the round trip drive time, etc., this will be an all day trip. The person purchasing the tickets will need a date and alternate date(s), plus an entrance time range in order to handle the ticket purchase. Those interested should consider trying for group meeting place/time, taking as few vehicles as possible, and caravanning down.

Susan Cole, would be willing to handle the ticket purchase, if necessary. We just need to make sure that we have a clear list of who can go - what days. And a clear understanding that if you sign up, you are OBLIGATED to pay for the ticket when purchased for a date that you signed up for. We might want to see if any of the other local people might be interested in going. However, the sooner we purchase the tickets, the greater chance we have of getting tickets for our first date choice.

Since we have to leave Orlando no later than midmorning, we might want to try to pre-plan a lunch stop. (But this is up to the group) I can check my AAA book and see what our best restaurant choices are along the way. Something besides McDonalds, but not too fancy/expensive either. If we caravan down, we can make sure each car has someone with a cell phone for communication. We also need to make sure that we have compatible people in the different car groups.

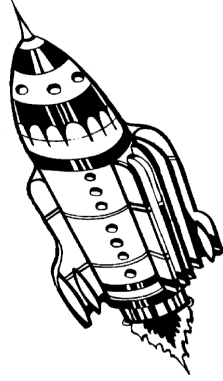
