Michael Flynn

I first read Flynn in Fallen Angels with Larry Niven and Jerry Pournelle. In a future where America has lost touch with science, two astronauts from a space station crash on Earth and are rescued by SF Fans. It was fun book celebrating fandom.

Flynn wrote a four book series set in the near future called *Firestar*. Mariesa van Huvten, an heiress concerned of a possible asteroid collision, decides to use her fortune to build a private space program. In doing so she also invests on educating the next generation of scientists and artists. We follow a group of students who becomes pilots, entrepreneurs, writers, and poets. There is great action and problem solving moments in this series.

In 2007, his novel *Eifelheim* was nominated for a Hugo. There aliens land in a small town in 14th century Germany. 

Akata Woman by Nnedi Okorafor (Lodestar Finalists) – Sunny and her friends must get an artifact back to a powerful being or there will sever consequences. This is a great trip adventure where many interesting things are seen.

Osmo Unknown and the Eightpenny Woods by Catherynne M. Valente Osmo is a boy who challenges the myths of his village, Littlebridge. The people of Littlebridge long ago made a treaty with the forest creatures Quidnunx, not to kill each other. Osmo's mother accidentally kills a Quidnunx and Osmo as the oldest child must go to the Eightpenny Wood and deal with the consequences. There he meets Bonk a rude half badger/half wombat and Never, a pangolin girl. Together they go to find the Eightpenny Woods and sort everything out. This was fun adventure with a great prose style. This is a great quest adventure with a few surprises.
