The Mirror Mended by Alix E. Harrow – Zinna Gray continues to help other versions of Sleeping Beauty. Along the way she comes into a world of Snow White and meets the Queen. Can Zinna help the Queen stop being evil? Does the Queen want that? An interesting take on another Disney-fied fairy tale.

What Moves the Dead by T. Kingfisher – A retelling of "Fall of the House of Usher" but with explanation to Madeline's illness. This is told from point of view a soldier friend of Roderick Usher. The clues to Madeline's problems are in full view. This is an alternate universe SF story. The explanation is plausible and we get the same ending. This was a good SF Mystery.

Where the Drowned Girls Go by Seanan McGuire – Cora was mermaid in the world she went to. She still hears forces from that world coming after her. She does not think Eleanor West's School for Wayward Children can help her so she transfers to Whitethorn Institute. The Whitethorn Institute drives the memories of the other worlds forcibly to help the children readjust to the world we all know. Will this help Cora? Is there another agenda at Whitethorn? Another excellent installment to this award winning series. Whitethorn is a scary alternative to

Elanor's methods. It may work for some but it may hurt others.

Even Though I Know the End by C.L. Polk—Helen "Elena" Brandt is a paranormal investigator in 1930s Chicago. She gets an offer by Marlowe, a very powerful demon, to find a serial killer. Marlowe makes an offer Brandt cannot refuse. The search for the serial killer is part of something bigger. Can Brandt navigate through this conflict and attain her prize? This feels like a Noir story with some interesting twists. This is a great Fantasy Mystery.

Ogres by Adrian Tchaikovsky – The world is run by Ogres, beings bigger than humans. Human live under their control. A human rebels against the Ogres. He escapes his village and goes on a journey where he will discover the secret of their world. This has a great idea and it is turned on its end.

Into the Riverlands by Nghi Vo—Wandering cleric Chih and his parrot Almost Brilliant go to a journey to Betany Docks. They are accompanied by a pair of young women and an older couple. They face challenges in their trip. The group exchanges stories from their homelands. This feels like *Cantebury Tales* or *Hyperion*. This is the third story in *The Singing Hills Cycle*. This does not require much knowledge of the other books.

Legends and Lattes by Travis Baldree - Viv, an Orc adventurer, decides to retire and startup a coffee shop. She finds friends to help with this new business. However there are forces which may want her to fail. This is the post quest story and it is great one.

Nettle and Bone by T. Kingfisher – Marra is the third daughter of royal family of small kingdom. Her older sister dies during her marriage to prince to a neighboring kingdom. Her other sister has to marry the prince and is endanger. She decides to save her sister. She learns skills she needs and makes allies to help her. Can she succeed? This is a great fantasy story. Marra is a great character. She sees a problems and figures out what she needs to solve it.

The Spare Man by Mary Robinette Kowal – Simply this is *The Thin Man* in space. Tesla Crane, her husband Shal Steward, and their dog Gimlet go on a honeymoon cruise to Mars from the Moon. Unfortunately there is a murder and Shal is the prime suspect. Can Tesla find the true culprit. The book does what it says giving some smart protagonists and an challenging problem. 
The Daughter of Doctor Moreau by Silvia Moreno-Garcia—A retelling of *The Island of Doctor Moreau* set on the Yucatan peninsula (which was once though to be an island). In 1871,

Doctor Moreau is researching to perfect humans by creating human-animal hybrids. He is assisted by his daughter Carlota. Moreau's patron Hernando Lizalde hires Montgomery Laughton to run Yaxaktun, the estate where Moreau does his research. Lizalde hopes Moreau to create a new workforce to replace rebellious native peoples. As time goes on Moreau's research has mixed results and Carlota grows into an intelligent and beautiful woman. What will happen if Lizalde pulls his support of the research? The story is told from the point of view of Carlota and Montgomery. Carlota is learning her place in the world and what that might entail. Montgomery is dealing of his past and how they effect his present. A great take on a SF classic.

Nona the Ninth by Tamsyn Muir – Nona finds herself without her memory but she is taken in by kind people. Forces are moving that could threaten all. Can Nona figure out her own identity in time? This is a simplification of one of the most complex plots ever. The characters are great. The plot demands one's full concentration. One of the best series of all time. I may need a second reading.

The Kaiju Preservation Society by John Scalzi – Jamie Gray takes a job in another world to help scientists research Kaiju. A Kaiju and its eggs disappear and Jamie and his colleagues have to find out what happen. Great world building here with a lot of detail about Kaijus and their world. The novel also covers our current fears.
